Germany - a celebration for the fans

he 1<sup>st</sup> July is the day. The day so many bike enthusiasts have been feverishly looking forward to for 30 years: a Tour start on German soil. The last time the best road cyclists of the planet went hunting for the yellow jersey in Germany in 1987, Helmut Kohl was still chancellor and Thomas Gottschalk moderated the famous German game show "Wetten, dass..." ("You Bet!") for the first time. The Berlin Wall was still standing and Western Berlin was the location for the "Grand Départ", before the route led over Karlsruhe, Stuttgart and Pforzheim to France. The dominating riders at that time: tour winner Stephen Roche, Pedro Delgado from Spain and the Frenchman Jean-François Bernard.

It's been a long time. Today, the top riders from the German point of view are Tony Martin, André Greipel, Marcel Kittel and John Degenkolb. They all stream to Düsseldorf to offer the metropolis on the Rhine River a top-class four-day cycling spectacle together with other top riders and their teams.

On Thursday, 29<sup>th</sup> June, already, the event will start with a presentation of the teams. In the stylish setting of Benrath Palace, the teams will present themselves to the cycling fans. On the following Friday, there will be an official team training before a 13-kilometre individual time trial will mark the beginning of the tour on Saturday.

Riders will start at "Messe Düsseldorf" (Düsseldorf Fair Centre) and then continue along the Rhine Bank, over the Königsallee and past the state parliament building and the opera house. It's a course designed for individual time trial specialists like Tony Martin, the 2013 world champion.

The very next day, the second stage will take place: This time, the riders will start at Düsseldorf Burgplatz and at Grafenberg, there will be a first mountain classification. After that, the peloton will ride back to Düsseldorf to continue over Meerbusch and Neuss to Mönchengladbach, where the first sprint classification is waiting. The stage will end in the Belgian town of Liège.

Not one but two Tour de France stages for Düsseldorf – a stroke of luck for Germany's cycling fans and the Rhine metropolis. "We can already feel the enthusiasm," mayor Thomas Geisel says happily. "Last year at Düsseldorf's Everyman's race "Race am Rhein", 4000 participants could already test the route of the second stage," he explains.

"Düsseldorf is a bicycle city. During the time trial and the second stage, the participants of the Tour de France, too, will experience how beautiful it is to cycle here. It's an excellent opportunity to promote the beauty of our region and the bicycle as an attractive means of transportation. Of course, the tour is also a strong signal for the German-French friendship."

There are thousands of stories and happenings around the Tour de France, the famous stage race across France. The race has experienced many ups and downs. Yet, 2017 is also a special year for German cycling in other respects.

Exactly 20 years ago, the first and up to now only German rider won the Tour de France: Jan Ullrich. In 1997, the cyclist from Rostock rode to Paris in the yellow jersey and thus encouraged a cycling boom. "I only came back to Germany nine weeks after the victory and after some other races and the welcome was incredible," Jan Ullrich says. "Thousands of people came to the autograph sessions. I could hardly go outdoors, as coaches full of people stopped in front of our house every day. It was crazy."







For Jan Ullrich, the story of the Tour victory had actually already begun one year before, in 1996. At the tender age of 22 years, he caused one sensation after the other with the Telekom team around Tour winner Bjarne Riis, sprinter Erik Zabel, Heppner, Aldag and Udo "Torture yourself, you bastard!" Bölts. "The 1996 Tour was one of the best for me. I didn't even think I could get a starting place. National coach Weibel actually wanted to take me to Olympia," says Ullrich, "but after I had shown a strong performance at the Tour de Suisse, the team management wanted to take me with them to the Tour de France that started only a few days later.

Ioneliness of Majorca

This had always been my big goal and I was incredibly happy to take part." After a  $3^{rd}$  place finish in the previous year, captain Bjarne Riis clearly had his eyes set on victory and the entire team did their best to realize this dream – including Jan Ullrich. "Back then, I didn't have any pressure, I put myself at the service of the team and even finished second. It was Bjarne who had all the work with the media and the stress after the race, I could relax and let myself be massaged," Jan Ullrich remembers. "Later, I experienced the double burden of media work and professional sport myself, but in 1996, I had really enjoyed my role as a helper."

Bjarne Riis appreciated the good teamwork and supported Jan Ullrich himself at the Tour in the following year. "Actually, Bjarne also started as a captain in 1997," Jan Ullrich knows, "but after I had shown a strong performance on the first two mountain stages, he gave me the goahead for the Andorra stage. It was a very long stage with four mountain passes and a tough last climb. Bjarne said to me: 'Do your thing today'. Not every team captain

would do that, it was incredibly fair of him. I was really lucky to have Bjarne as my captain." Ullrich wore the yellow jersey through to Paris and thus achieved something no other German rider has ever achieved.

"Ulle" was already fascinated by the Tour de France in his early years in the GDR. "In sport school, we already admired top riders like Fignon, Lemond, Indurain – the big Miguel," Ullrich still goes into raptures today. "We sat in front of the television as if spellbound. Everything was so colourful and modern, just like we expected the West to be. In Eastern Germany, the "Friedensfahrt" tour was the big event. "Friedensfahrt" - this was blue, red and grey jerseys. The Tour de France was more colourful, more spectacular, it was a bit like Disneyland. From the moment the Berlin Wall was opened, the Tour de France became my big goal."

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The ambition to achieve this goal grew with every victory. "Year after year, I achieved one success after the other," Jan Ullrich explains. "It was all step by step: junior world championships, GDR champion, national team -I achieved or even exceeded the goals set and my motivation was growing. As additional motivation, we also got aluminium bearings

or an aluminium drivetrain system for our steel bikes when winning a race. This was something very special back then," Ullrich says with a grin. However, after all, it is the love of cycling that brought him from one success to the other. "It's not possible without love and devotion, you wouldn't accept the stresses and strains it involves. For me, this is a very important aspect to be successful."

I remember a race in Freiburg in 2000, when the Spanish or Italian riders came to us in disbelieve asking 'What's happening here?'," Ulle goes into raptures. Thursday, 29<sup>th</sup> June 2017: Team presentation

Friday, 30 June 2017: Official training of the teams

#### Saturday, 1<sup>st</sup> July 2017:

1st stage: Individual time trial, 13 kilometres. Start and finish at "Messe Düsseldorf". From here, the riders will continue southwards over the "Oberkassel" bridge to the left Rhine bank. They will ride on the Kaiser-Wilhelm-Ring in the direction of the "Rheinkniebrücke" bridge, past the state parliament building and along the

Königsallee to the opera house and back to "Messe Düsseldorf".

### Sunday, 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2017:

2<sup>nd</sup> stage: 9-kilometre long, neutralized start from Burgplatz. To Grafenberg (mountain classification), Erkrath and Mettmann, over Ratingen back to Düsseldorf. The riders will continue to Meerbusch, Neuss, Kaarst-Büttgen, Mönchengladbach (sprint classification), the district of Düren and Aachen through to the destination in the Belgian town of Liège.



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### **12 QUESTIONS FOR** JAN ULLRICH

HE IS GERMANY'S BEST KNOWN ROAD CYCLIST AND THE NEW BRAND AMBASSADOR FOR ROSE BIKES: JAN ULLRICH. IN 1997, HE WAS THE FIRST AND UNTIL NOW ONLY GERMAN TO WIN THE TOUR DE FRANCE, HE WAS WORLD CHAMPION AND OLYMPIC GOLD MEDALLIST. THERE ARE ONLY A FEW PEOPLE WHO HAVE INSPIRED AND MOTIVATED AS MANY CYCLISTS AS THE RIDER FROM ROSTOCK. TODAY, HE LIVES IN MAJORCA TOGETHER WITH HIS FAMILY AND ORGANIZES CAMPS FOR ROAD CYCLING ENTHUSIASTS. 12 QUESTIONS ABOUT A LIFE AS A ROAD CYCLIST!

### Get a proper job!" my mum used to say. Jan, what would you have done, if you hadn't become a professional road cyclist? This question has never really

come up in my life and I actually don't know the answer. I started cycling when I was nine years old and after that, I went to a sport school in the GDR. I wanted to become a world champion, an Olympic gold medallist, so I didn't have the time to think about it. Today I think I maybe would have become a carpenter. I'd love to work with wood. We have a carpenter here in Majorca who builds beautiful objects. Or maybe I would have followed in the footsteps of my grandpa who comes from agriculture. When I was a child I used to sit next to him on the tractor when he harvested sugar beets. I like to be outside in nature and to create something with my own hands.

### **02** You have seen half the world – what is your favourite place to cycle?

Everywhere the weather is nice. For me, this is very important. I have always been a child of the sun. Today, we live in Majorca which is – as you probably know – a cyclist's paradise. It is so much fun to cycle here. There are so many beautiful little fishing villages you can explore on your bike and you can do tough as well as easy tours... In the past, it used to be an island of work for me with six, seven hours of sweating blood every day with photographers next to me – and I was always in the press. Today, I rather see it as an island of enjoyment. Yet I also like to cycle in other countries, for example in South Africa or Colorado. What I like best is cycling in the mountains, where you can see the sea and let your gaze wander.

**03**Your favourite bike? The X-LITE matt black carbon bike with the new wireless groupset by SRAM. What I love about it is the handling, that is to say: How do you get downhill, is it made for Paris Roubaix, is it long and hard to handle or are you also able to take narrow corners and slopes. The bike is ultra-lightweight and very stiff, the power from the pedals is transferred into propulsion and doesn't get lost in the bottom bracket. And even though you can again show colours, I like its matt black colour. It simply has a timeless beauty.

**O4** Are you a good loser? I think so, now I am. Sometimes, you can also come out a winner when losing, if you let it happen. Even though you always want to win a race as a pro, you know: Only 30 of 100 races in a year are your personal highlights. All other races also mean hard work, yet it's rather about the team, about other things. As a pro, you usually know how to lose. Nobody likes to lose, but when it comes to showing great strength of character, it is actually very easy for me. I can also ride slowly for instance, which many cycling pros can't. I also like to ride with my kids and with my wife or friends. I like to do a nice tour where you stop to enjoy a cappuccino.

**05** If you had to describe yourself in three words, what would they be? I'd say I'm a very warm person, I'm open and a generous family man. So, if it had to be three words: warm, open, generous.

### 06<sup>What kind of sport do you like</sup> most apart from cycling and

why? I like outdoor sports. I just hate to do sports in a gym or in a fitness centre, I prefer to be outside in nature. My second big love is skiing. My whole family likes to ski and we try to get into the mountains and out for some fresh air as often as possible. Skiing also is a technical sport with a lot of speed, just like cycling. Besides, I like all kinds of water sport, as I was born at the Baltic Sea. We are currently planning to learn kitesurfing and I also like to swim – I like everything that has something to do with the element water. **O7** Everyone remembers spectacular racing situations from your life as a professional road cyclist – what was your toughest moment in a race? Usually, you successfully repress those memories, yet I'll never forget the moment I lost the Tour de France on the stage from Grenoble to Les Deux Alpes in 1998. It was pouring, it was cold, we had to do three big passes and the finish was on top of a hill, too. I was in the yellow jersey. On top of the Galibier it was four degrees and you couldn't really wear a rain jacket, as it was so dangerous downhill. Down in the valley where everyone was eating bars, I was still in a good position. Pantani had to get me out of the pedals, as I did not have the power to do so. This was the first and last time I hit the wall like this. Otherwise, I would have probably reacted differently. I would have stopped for two minutes to eat and drink something. In this way, I would have maybe lost only six minutes, but not the Tour de France.

**08** Where do you see yourself in ten years? Will you still be devoted to cycling? I will be devoted to cycling for the rest of my life. I take part in all those cycling events, because I love cycling and I see that the people are happy to hear me telling some



was ahead, but this was not a problem, as he was three minutes behind me in the overall standings. Then I had a flat. Everyone in front of me was eating and I - young, hectic, no one knew what was happening - had to pull over to the right and thought 'Oh, I think I'm running out of energy now'. On the next climb, I bonked like none of you can imagine. My blood sugar level seemed to be as low as it can be. I lost 9 minutes on that climb and thus the Tour de France. This is something you cannot repress and won't forget. This was the toughest situation I've ever had. My brain ran riot, I could no longer think. All I did was pedalling instinctively. After having crossed the finishing line, they

stories from the past and motivating them. I hope I will still be able to cycle and organize my camps for a long time. What I also have in mind is to motivate kids. My idea is to open a kind of sport school to get young people away from the couch and onto the bike. This would be fun. However, you never know what the situation will be like in ten years. As one door closes, another opens...

### **09** What do you always carry with you when taking your bike out for a

**ride?** I always have a little emergency bag with me with money – at least 100 euros – my smartphone and a little multitool. I also often carry a tyre and an emergency bar with me. I never need it, but you never know. Besides, I usually take a light windbreaker with me, just in case it starts to rain or it's getting cold on top of the mountain.

**10** What was your favourite stage of the Tour de France? To be honest, it has always been the last stage to Paris, when the strain is over and your family is waiting for you after three and a half weeks. The people at the Champs-Élysées are great. You ride into the city and take a lap of honour. And if you are successful and win the yellow jersey, you will have even more moments of happiness. And then there is the Andorra stage

I won in 1997. This is where I got the yellow jersey, this mountain suits me perfectly. It was an extremely long, hard stage, but I was in a good form. I felt as if I was carried up the mountain. I have climbed that mountain (up to Andorra-Arcalis, editor's note) once again at the Vuelta in 1999 and took over the purple jersey. You will never forget the mountain where you won the yellow jersey for the first time. This has always been my childhood dream.

**11** Did you ever get lost during training? No, never. I'm always well prepared. I often also had a team around me and the events are done with guides. I know the roads in Majorca and apart from little blind alleys you reach from time to time or little detours, nothing has happened to me so far. I also have a Garmin with a 'Bring me Home' button, however, I haven't used it yet.

**12** You have met a lot of people in your life. What personalities from sports, politics and culture have impressed you the most? I'm generally impressed by people's achievements. My sport idol is Miguel Indurain, a five-time tour winner. He already impressed me when I saw him on television as a child. He was always surrounded by an incredible aura, he radiated a sense of calm and sovereignty. I also liked the way he won races his opponents were despaired of with a smile on his face. Someday, I could ride next to him and I thought by myself: "The big Miguel Indurain in a gruppetto

together with the little Jan Ullrich..." I was just as happy as if I had won.

THE "INDUSTRIAL HERITAGE TRAIL" (GERMAN: ROUTE DER INDUSTRIEKULTUR) LEADS ACROSS THIS BRAVE NEW WORLD – AND WE WERE RIGHT IN THE MIDDLE OF IT, FOLLOWING THE TRAILS OF ORE AND COAL.

he sky is burning over the Rhine-Herne Canal. Yet, even though the rising sun bathes the environment in orange light, the air is still fresh. I further pull up the zipper of my jacket; the wind is blowing cold. I lean against the parapet of the Grimberger Sichel bridge and wait for my father.

We have parked our car nearby. We thought the Grimberger Sichel bridge in Gelsenkirchen-Bismarck would be a perfect starting point for our tour. The bikes were quickly unloaded and ready to go. The crescent-shaped bridge was only a few metres away. So, we could have started our trip immediately – if my father hadn't forgotten the replacement tube inside the car.

"Got it!" he shouts from far away while riding up the bridge. "That's just like dad," I think and wave at him. Today is our day, a real daddy-daughter day. We have planned this tour for guite some time and the Industrial Heritage Trail has long been on our bucket list.

We have decided for the section called "Following the trails of ore and coal" (German: Auf den Spuren des Erzes und der Kohle). It is 42 kilometres long and leads past numerous sights like the Grimberger Sichel bridge we are currently standing on.

### The Industrial Heritage Trail has long been on our bucket list.

"A nice bridge!" my father says after having stopped next to me, looking around. And it is indeed. The suspension bridge was built in 2009 and has just one single pylon that is anchored at the north bank of the river to hold the curved construction. The bustle here is guite astounding. There are already many cyclists crossing the Grimberger Sichel bridge early in the morning. We join the soft stream of cyclists and start to pedal, as there is a lot to discover forus today.

My dad is fit. As a road cyclist, he is in top form. However today, he sits on a trekking bike – just like me. I ride a MULTISPORT TREKKING LADIES, my dad has the same model in the men's version. The bikes are true sporting aces, which can already be derived from the extremely sporty frame. It is made from 6013 T6/2 Altanium, weighs only around 1490 grams, is double-butted and extremely stiff. I especially like the great finish with smooth weld seams and internally routed cables. It's a very sporty basis for a fast bike. The bike's components, too, are of high quality: Mavic XM319 Disc wheels roll extremely well together with Schwalbe's Marathon Supreme Reflex tyres. A highquality Shimano XT rear derailleur ensures precise shifting.

My disc brake also bears an XT label. For me, a disc brake should be part of any good trekking bike, as it also works reliably in rain and always delivers full power. We ride westwards along the Rhine-Herne Canal and after around eight kilometres, we arrive at the Nordsternpark. It is located on the former coal mine site Nordstern.

"Do you still remember the day we visited the Federal horticulture show here?" my father asks me while we are rolling onto the site. "That must have been in 1997!"

Of course I do. Together with my brother, I ran through the park-like green spaces that still have a special charm today. During summer, there is hustle and bustle. The beer garden is full of people and you can hear the children playing in the kids' area consisting of a huge water playground and 18-metre high, artificial climbing rocks.

You can also marvel at the Hercules of Gelsenkirchen, an 18-metre high statue created by artist Markus Lüpertz, in the Nordsternpark. Like a park sentry, he is sitting enthroned on the former winding tower of the colliery. At the Nordsternpark in Gelsenkirchen,

we leave the circuit and take a little detour towards Bottrop. We ride past the former spoil tip "Schurenbachhalde" and the garden town of Welheim, a workers' housing estate typical for Bottrop. We can already see our next destination from far away: the Tetrahedron. It seems to magically hover above the former spoil tip "Beckstraße". The correct name of this three-sided pyramid actually is "Haldernereignis Emscherblick", but you can't go very far with German officialese in the Ruhr area.

From Beckstraße, we take a gravel path up the tip. It takes us 9 hairpin bends and 120 metres up to the plateau. Here, you can see the impressive steel construction in full size. It is 70 metres high and consists of 210 tons of steel and tubes with a total length of 1,5 kilometres.

We park our bikes and climb up the first metres of the Tetrahedron, but then my father signals his refusal. "You have to go on your own, I already feel dizzy when looking down!" My dear dad and his fear of heights! I go up to the first platform. The view is impressive, it is a great 360-degree view over the Ruhr area. On a clear day, you can even see the Rhine Tower of Düsseldorf approximately 40 kilometres away.

I look down. The grating below me offers a free view through to the ground. Now I start to feel a bit uncomfortable, too. The stairs and platforms are suspended by steel ropes and slightly move. In stronger wind, you might even get seasick. The Tetrahedron can be seen as a symbol of the modern world on the Industrial Heritage Trail. Everywhere you go, a bridge is built between past and modern times with a brittle backdrop and art and culture as an exciting counterpart.

We leave the Tetrahedron plateau and the lunar landscape on the former spoil tip Beckstraße. A small downhill section is waiting for us. Now it proves advantageous that our bikes are not only fast, but also extremely comfortable.

The Suntour air suspension forks on our trekking bikes pleasantly absorb small irregularities of the partly bumpy gravel road. 63 millimetres of travel offer enough reserves for a relaxed downhill ride. The ROSE RC-170 Flex carbon seatpost also offers high comfort.

My father's bike is also equipped with these two comfortable components. Differences can be found at the saddle though. My father sits on a Terry Figura GT Gel Men saddle, while my bike is equipped with a Terry Figura GT Gel Women. It's a saddle that is especially adapted to the female anatomy, so that you can comfortably sit on it despite its sporty design.

Next stop: The Zollverein coal mine in Essen, probably the highlight of our tour. It really deserves the title of the "most

beautiful coal mine in the world" and was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2001. It is an unparalleled work of art. Large parts of the plant are still preserved and allow for an unvarnished look to the mine's past. It is hard to resist the morbid charm. Huge, dilapidated buildings stand next to rusty plants – it looks like a scene from a post-apocalyptic movie.

The Zollverein coal mine was active between 1851 and 1986 and produced over three million tons of coal per year in its best days. After it was shut down, the state of North Rhine-Westphalia bought the premises and turned them into the largest monument of the city of Essen.

Today, around 1,5 million people visit "Zeche Zollverein" each year to marvel at the lovely architecture, visit exhibitions, swim in the works' swimming pool or relax in one of the restaurants. "What a huge facility," my dad says. "This gives you an impression of how it must have been like in the past!" "Come, let's go to the other side to the coking plant!" I nod at him.

The Zollverein coking plant is part of the complete World Heritage ensemble. Here, coke and raw gas were produced until 1993 and it was considered to be one of Europe's most modern coking plants. At the machine side next to the coke ovens, an ice rink is opened for four weeks in winter. Marco Polo guides call it "the probably most fascinating place to go ice-skating nationwide". As the area is guite large, it is absolutely



paths welcome cyclists with open arms. We slowly cruise across this impressive open-air museum.

"Now I'm getting hungry!" I complain to my father. "Shall we go to one of those cafés over there?" "I've got a better idea," he says with a grin and quickly rides away. I'm curious and follow him. Shortly after, he stops at a food stall. "What would a tour across the Ruhr area be without a visit of a fast food stall?" he shouts and parks his bike

perfect to be discovered by bike. Well-built

with a laugh. I have to agree. After all, the Ruhr area is known for the best currywurst in the world. "Our food stall has already existed for more than 30 years," the shopkeeper tells us.

"Of course, currywurst with French fries is still the classic dish." We want to know whether his business has suffered from the closure of the coal mines. "Not really," he answers. "It has just changed. The guests are different today, but business goes as well as ever."

This might be a good final word to describe the changes of the Ruhr area, but we are not yet at the finish. We still have to go back to our car. The Zollverein path leads us to the Kray-Wanner line, a former railway line that was converted into a cycle path. It leads us past the Rhine-Elb tip to the Erzbahnstraße (ore line). From here, we ride back to Gelsenkirchen-Bismarck. Again, we cross the Grimberger Sichel bridge and comfortably roll to our car.

We are flabbergasted and impressed by this tour. Decades of industrial culture roll by at breakneck speed, you ride across green areas you would not expect in the Ruhr area and up on former spoil tips with fantastic views. Every seven, eight kilometres, there is another attraction. It is nice to see how a region presumed dead has changed, and how it constantly reinvents itself and dispenses pure life.

- When riding longer distances, you should use chamois cream! It might feel a bit unfamiliar at first, but you soon won't do without it ever again!
- When buying a bike, make sure that size, handlebar width, components etc. are adapted to your body, references and skills, as well as to the intended use. ROSE offers ladies' models that are especially adapted to the female anatomy.
- If a ladies' model should not fit, a men's model with the right modifications might also be an option. ROSE Bikes offers the possibility to customize many components and for special looks, you can maybe also use a colourful handlebar tape.

lift my head and look to the left. "Hey, are you okay?" All I can see are two mudcaked legs. "Yes, why are you asking?" I reply. The mud-caked legs start to laugh. "Because you are lying splayed out at the foot of a redwood tree." "Oh, I see. Right. I'm fine, thanks." This is only when I realize how bizarre this entire scene must look like. I actually just wanted to take a breath. "I slipped on a wet root and landed here. I just stayed here on the ground for a while. Everything's fine. I'm ready to go," I say while getting up and back on the saddle, which is quite difficult, as I am fully exhausted. Of course, I did not think that a seven-day MTB stage race in the front garden of the Rocky Mountains is a walk in the park. Yet I had no idea that the BC Bike Race would be that tough.

And I was well prepared! I trained my condition, rode technical trails till the cows come home and took a really good bike with me: the GROUND CONTROL. It is a real weapon made for those wet, rooty trails over here. I intentionally decided against a 29er, which I surely would have preferred on an easier marathon course. The trails of the BC Bike Race are demanding and winding, you can only rarely find longer gravel sections. The 27,5" wheels of my GROUND CONTROL are way more

agile and accelerate better because of their low mass. When riding up and down and curling through the Canadian forests, these riding characteristics really prove advantageous for me. The rear suspension is tight, nothing will sink down. And with 130 mm of travel, it offers an impressive performance, even on rough tracks.

Some kilometres later, I finally reach today's stage finish. Breathing heavily, I lay my head on the handlebar. "I bet you feel like I look." I look up and have to laugh. Brett Tippie smiles back. He is something like the mascot of the BC Bike Race. Whether in the camp or on the course: He always spreads good vibes with crazy disguises and euphoric encouragements. I wipe away the mud from my face and stand up. "You have mastered the fourth day of the race. That's almost half of it. You can be proud of yourself," says Tippie and gives me a slap on my shoulder.

While I am pushing my GROUND CONTROL to the drop-off station, I realize that I have indeed already managed four stages. Four days with more than 210 kilometres of wildest wildness. Four days in which I have climbed up almost 5500 metres in altitude and dashed down the same amount afterwards.

Four days through heaven and hell.

Four days through gentle coniferous forests and over rough gravel paths, fallen trees and moss-grown rocks, rocky coastal paths and beautiful singletracks, winding and blocked jungle sections, including great views over waters and mountains. Four days through heaven and hell. As if I were a tennis ball, I bounced between both. Heaven: the Rocky Mountains in sunlight. Hell: the steepest downhill tracks of my life. Heaven: the most flowing singletracks of my life.

In order to understand my ambivalent attitude towards the BC Bike Race, you must know that I only started mountain biking about one and a half years ago.

I come from the road cycling sector and have successfully rushed over asphalt on smooth tread tyres for over 20 years. This is why I have no major problems with condition and uphill torture. What bothers me though is my lack of riding technique.


The rough course

As I said, I have trained a lot, yet there is no place where you can really prepare for British Columbia - except British Columbia. The Canadians who live here have supernatural riding skills and an extraordinary feeling for their bikes, especially when riding across the country and down to the valley at breakneck speed. Impressive!

A loud, artificial cock scream that is sent through a megaphone to echo across the tent camp wakes me up. I crawl out of my tent and feel fresh. I'm glad I did without a campfire beer and went to bad early last night. Day five, North Vancouver is on the agenda, the world-famous "Northshore". This is the stage I fear the most. Those who are careless today or lose control of their bike will fall deeper than usual.

In the first four days, the course was rather rainy and slippery. Fortunately, today is a dry day and the track is in good condition. A man from Munich is standing at the start line grinning like a Cheshire cat. Hans is 45 years old and already takes part in this race for the third time. He gives me the thumbs up. "Don't worry about your concentration today. The entire stage is a single cocktail of endorphin and adrenaline. You are a guest of the world's most famous mountain bike trails, so enjoy it", and off Hans goes. Uphill, I'm one of the fastest riders. The other riders already know me. "Attention, ROSE is coming!" they have shouted every time I attack from behind since the third day. Thanks to a balanced geometry, my GROUND CONTROL climbs uphill like a chamois.

A central riding position and its incredible efficiency give me a significant performance advantage. Regarding the components, I rely on established products. A RockShox Pike fork at the front not only offers excellent suspension qualities, but is also uncomplicated and very reliable. During the entire race, it has not had the slightest problem with rain, mud or dirt.

The excellent RockShox Monarch rear shock takes the same line. The Reverb dropper seatpost has proven to be indispensable. It offers a significant advantage with regards to riding dynamics and on extremely steep sections, you can simply get it out of the way with one click. Today, I am doing astonishingly well on the technically very demanding downhill sections. I am concentrated and the balanced chassis of my bike encourages me even more. Today, I am in the middle

of the field and cross the finishing line without any serious falls. I am extremely happy. In the evening, the sky brightens up and the sun is shining on our camp and the small coastal town of Squamish. It is simply breathtaking, just like the entire landscape during the race. This alone is reason enough to travel here. From Squamish, the route leads 53 kilometres over finest, worldclass singletracks like the famous "Bonanza" trail to the finish on the next day. Perfect but for the rain. "A nice slip-and-slide today,"

my Canadian tent neighbours say with a wink. "And as the icing on the cake, you will even get Whistler tomorrow," Hans explains me with a grin at the campfire.

The racing atmosphere is unique. Maybe 10 percent of the 600 participants ride for a good result, all others simply enjoy the BC Bike Race experience. I am infected with the good mood and the anticipation of the next day and only crawl into my tent late at night.



The organisers have packed the last 27 kilometres of the race with everything a mountain biker could wish for. Flowing trails with a rhythm you cannot resist. Brutal climbs with names like "Heart Break Climb". Lots of disguised, clapping and cheering spectators that push all riders to their limits. When speeding out of the forest and into a bend, I can see the last downhill track of the 2016 BC Bike Race. The last trail down to the Rainbow Lake.

There is no better name for this finish. It is hard to describe the emotions that are running through my body at that moment. It feels a bit like you were sitting on a bench shivering with nervousness and joy while the best girl in the world is giving you a kiss. Thanks Canada. These 300 kilometres and 9200 metres up- and downhill will always stick in my memory – just like fantastic British Columbia. 🔳

The trail version with a 150 mm fork on the contrary comes with a steeper seat and head tube angle for improved cornering and more propulsion. Depending on the setup, the PIKES PEAK has different riding characteristics," explains Max Sistenich, developer at ROSE Bikes. Another metamorphosis is offered by the brand-new PROGEO technology patented by ROSE Bikes and used for the first time on the PIKES PEAK. "PROGEO allows the rider to adapt the characteristics of the PIKES PEAK to the prevailing terrain with a flick of the wrist and on the fly, e.g. on the trail. The term is composed of the words progression and geometry. Progression describes the rear stay characteristics and the resulting bottom-out protection. By setting up the bike's geometry, you can adjust head and seat tube angle, as well as the bottom bracket drop," says Max about the new feature. With the PIKES PEAK, the bicycle brand from Bocholt has also successfully set an example in respect of design. The modern geometry of the PIKES PEAK is characterized by an especially long top tube, yet a short stem of 30 to 40 mm harmoniously compensates this length. Thanks to 430 mm short chain stays, the bike offers an agile ride despite its huge reach. **ROSE PRODUCT DESIGNER** MAX SISTENICH ABOUT PROGEO Max, you are the one who developed PROGEO. How does this new system work? PROGEO offers you four different positions for the rear shock linkage. Whether quick-response or soft, a steep angle for technical sections or a flat one for speedy downhill rides - with PROGEO, you will quickly find the right setup. Gener-ally, you can say that the more progression you have, the tighter the suspension will be. The rider gets direct feedback from the ground and becomes one with the trail. With less progression, the suspension will be more forgiving and the rear stay will easily eliminate rough grounds. As regards geometry, the customer can either choose a flat geometry, the so-called SLACK position, or increase the head and seat tube angle of the PIKES

PEAK by 1° in the STEEP position for more agility on winding trails.

#### Which of the four PROGEO settings is best for which terrain in your point

of view? PROGEO turns the PIKES PEAK into a real all-rounder with a huge range of use. With high progression and a steep geometry, you can pedal your bike with great efficiency and easily climb mountains. Therefore, the PROGEO setting "PRO: HIGH/GEO: STEEP" is perfectly suitable for tricky uphill sections. When set to "PRO: MID/GEO: STEEP", the bike has medium progression, which is perfect for technical trails with tight corners. A flat geometry corresponding to the PROGEO mode "SLACK" is perfect for riding downhill

In combination with medium progression, e.g. the third possible setting "PRO: MID/ GEO: SLACK", the PIKES PEAK is turned into a downhill artist for speedy trails with large drops and compressions that require great bottom-out protection. If the downhill is rather fast and flowing, with roots and high-speed sections, I recommend a lower progression in combination with a flat geometry, that is to say the PROGEO setting "PRO: LOW/GEO: SLACK".

How do you set up the PROGEO positions? It doesn't take rocket science to adjust the positions so that even technically unexperienced riders will be able to do so: Customers can adjust the desired position via a flip chip that is securely integrated into the frame using the

6 mm hex key of their multitool. A spring preload makes sure the position snaps into place easily. The advantage of our system is that adjustments can quickly be made at the side of the trail, as no moving parts must be removed. In this way, you won't lose any small parts on your tour.

How long have you been working on the development? We fairly quickly knew what the basic parameters should be and swiftly made the first drafts.

However, until the start of production and the perfect interaction between PROGEO and the PIKES PEAK, it took us around three years to develop, construct and intensively test the bike. Rome was not built in a day!

broken rear derailleurs that could get caught in the spokes - their range of use is almost limitless. They can also be used for clothes: defective helmet closures, slipping trousers - simply cable tie together what can be cable tied together.



Better than walk ing: unorthodox saddle renair



Sharp rocks or a nail in a board are enough to slash the tyre casing. The tube is patched in no time, yet it presses through the hole in the outer tyre when inflating it. What next? The best solution is to solve this problem with duct tape, you should always have some duct tape with you.

You do not need to carry a whole roll in their backpack.



A broken spoke does not have to be the end of your ride. It is only important to keep a few things in mind though. To prevent damages, you should remove the broken spoke, if possible. If this is not possible, fix it with a zip tie or duct

tape. If you should have a spoke key with you, you can temporarily true the wheel. Carefully tighten the spoke a guarter turn and check the result! The neighbouring spokes of the broken one should be tightened (anti-clockwise), the



A featherlight helper in need a chain lock



Broken chains are annoying and not rare. Since nobody voluntarily takes a chain with her/him on a tour and chain repairs are not quite easy to carry out without the right tools, it is recommended to always have a chain lock with you. Important: Inform yourself how to use the chain lock beforehand and make sure you have

got the right chain lock for your chain no chain lock is like the other! Moreover, you should remove bent links of the broken chain using the right tool before fitting the chain link.

At minimum cost and a low weight, you are perfectly prepared for a chain defect!



though, it's enough to take a piece of it and wrap it e.g. around a CO<sup>2</sup> cartridge to save space. In case of a punctured tyre, the tape is pasted on the inside. Those who do not have tape should have a look

The packaging of an energy bar, a folded piece of paper or a banknote will also do.

However, you need to be careful. It goes without saying that you must not ride at full speed, yet the repair will help you to slowly ride home.

Emergency wheel truing: Check the result after a quarter turn!

opposite spokes can be slightly loosened (clockwise). When using rim brakes, you can also open the brake caliper, if the wheel is heavily buckled – but keep in mind that this will reduce braking performance!

ho: My name is Sascha Hartmann, I live in Holtenau and work as a personal trainer. My profession involves doing a lot of sports, yet I only started mountain biking in 2011. Since then I have been infected. Together with my friends, I ride through the surrounding forests in my free time, always looking for new trails. Yet in my function as a personal trainer, too, I do a lot of tours with athletes with different performance levels.

What: Sascha's dream MTB is the ROOT MILLER 4. The full-suspension trail bike with 140 mm of travel, 27,5"+ wheels, a 1x12 drivetrain and a low weight covers a huge range of use and offers a convincing combination of climbing qualities and trail performance.

Why this bike: For my private life as well as enough travel reserves to let rip. It comes with a longer top tube and a downhill performance - and more fun!

How did you customize the ROOT MILLER to suit your requirements?



1x12 drivetrain – extreme spread of gears for extreme versatility

for my job, I was looking for a highly versatile bike. I wanted the bike to be comfortable on longer tours, yet not too heavy, but with

I fairly quickly found that the ROOT MILLER is the right choice for me, as it offers nearly everything I expect from a mountain bike. A good friend of mine has been riding this model for quite some time now and he is fully satisfied. In contrast to the model he rides, the new ROOT MILLER offers slightly more suspension with 140 mm on front and rear, as well as a more modern geometry: slackened head angle, which ensures better

The biggest change I made clearly is the wheel size. The ROOT MILLER actually is a 29er. In contrast to the other models, ROSE has designed the ROOT MILLER 4 as a 27,5" + bike, that is to say that a 27,5-inch wheelset is combined with really wide tyres. The ROOT MILLER can be equipped with different wheel sizes: With 29 inches - the classic - but also with 27,5"+ wheels. I have stuck to the proven XM 1501 wheelset by DT Swiss in my dream configuration, as it is lightweight, well finished and incredibly reliable - even though I chose it in 27,5 inches and with a 40 mm rim for extra-wide tyres. The tyres come from Schwalbe: I opted for the Nobby Nic in the Snake Skin version pimped to a generous 2,8 width. For me, the advantage clearly is in the downhill performance: The 27,5"+ bike also keeps cool on rough trails and

simply irons out every bump, which means a gain in comfort and fun. I also glady accept the fact that the bike lacks a bit of zippiness compared to a 29er due to heavier tyres.

The X01 Eagle groupset by SRAM is responsible for shifting. It comes with a 12-speed rear derailleur and a single chainring at the front – and a quite big one. Instead of a 30-tooth chainring in the standard configuration of the 29er ROOT MILLER 3, my 4 series model comes with a chainring with 34 teeth. This gives me the advantage of being able to choose a higher gear at high speeds to achieve even more top-end speed. My wish for a dropper seatpost has come true with the RockShox Reverb Stealth. High-guality suspension elements by FOX and a SRAM Guide RSC brake top off my dream bike. Configured like this, the ROOT MILLER 4 costs  $\in$  4299, which is only € 100 more than a ROOT MILLER 3. Considering what an ingenious overall package you get for this price, this is just excellent.



Have you achieved your custom-made goal? In my view, this is exactly the configuration I wished for. The ROOT MILLER 4 allows me to have lots of fun on the trail with my friends and to go on MTB tours with my clients.

The bike's versatility is huge, not least because of the possibility to use two different wheel sizes. Maybe I'll give myself a second wheelset in 29 inches as a Christmas present. With that, I'll have two bikes in one!

THE COMPANY'S PORTFOLIO INCLUDES THE BRANDS ROCKSHOX, TRUVATIV, ZIPP AND QUARQ – ALL KNOWN FOR INNOVATIVE PRODUCTS OF EXTREMELY HIGH QUALITY. WHAT ONLY FEW PEOPLE KNOW: THE LARGE US-AMERICAN COMPANY PLACES GREAT EMPHASIS ON THE GERMAN ART OF ENGINEERING. ALL DRIVETRAINS ARE DEVELOPED IN GERMANY. REASONS ENOUGH FOR CYCLE STORIES TO LEAVE THE OFFICE AND TAKE A LOOK BEHIND THE SCENES OF SRAM!

he sofa I sit on and wait is bright red and very comfy. The ground and walls of the hall-like office are painted white. Not only the 14 000-square metre large building complex is dominated by this colour combination, but the entire company site is. Sure, red and white are the colours of SRAM's logo. What rather attracts my attention though is the hustle and bustle around me.

I'm in the development centre of SRAM in Schweinfurt, Germany. There is plenty of space, as if they wanted to leave creative heads room for ideas and innovations. In one corner, small groups are standing at large tables and have lively discussions over sketches and drawings. Next to them, two young men have spread out sprockets in front of themselves and are lost in thought. Between all these isles of creativity, other employees are bustling about doing their day's work. "Sometimes it's like in a beehive," a voice next to me says. "Hello, you must be the editor of Cycle Stories. My name is Bernhard Johanni, I'm the managing director of SRAM Germany," the person opposite me says. I nod and shake the hand I'm offered.

"I was told that you wanted to take a look behind the scenes." I nod again while I am getting a worn notepad and my analogue Lomo LC-A camera out of the bag. "I have prepared some questions," I say hastily. Mr. Johanni laughs. "I'd suggest we get a coffee first. After that, I will tell you something about SRAM and show you around so that you can see what we are doing here in Schweinfurt. If you should have any more questions and space on your paper after that, I will be happy to answer them all."

As I fully agree with his plan, we sit in the bright and friendly designed cafeteria with little pieces of art made of espresso beans and milk froth in front of us a few moments later. To understand why a US-American company runs such a huge location in the German town of Schweinfurt, you have to look back into the past. To be more precise, you have to look back 123 years. In 1894, a young man left a German patent office with plans for a bicycle hub in his pocket. This young and innovative developer was Ernst Sachs. One year later, he founded "Fichtel & Sachs" internal hub gear production in Schweinfurt together with his partner Karl Fichtel. Only a few years later, Ernst Sachs set a real milestone of bicycle technology. His legendary Torpedo freewheel hub soon became a bestseller and had by far the largest market share in Germany at the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

"This is where history provides a first link to SRAM," Mr. Johanni starts to tell, "because before we took over Fichtel & Sachs, our company, too, had grown big with such a milestone in bicycle technology. Stanley Day, a passionate triathlete and co-founder of SRAM, had never been a fan of the then usual shifters on the down tube. Therefore, he searched for a possibility to change gears on the handlebar. This was in 1987 and this year also marks the date of birth of the twist shifter, the Gripshift. This was the first product and the starting signal for the success story of SRAM." "Why SRAM? What does the name mean?" I interpose a guestion. "SRAM is an acronym for the names of the company founders. Scott, Ray and Sam, of which Ray is the second name of the previously mentioned Stanley."

Ten years after the invention of the Gripshift, SRAM was still rather a newcomer on the huge bicycle market. It was time to grow and to follow new avenues. In 1997, the company took over the bicycle hub division of the German manufacturer "Mannesmann Sachs AG", previously "Fichtel & Sachs". Back then, the founders in the USA rec-ognized the historical tradition of Schweinfurt, as well as the enormous importance of this location for innovative developments in the bicycle sector and the access to the European market. Therefore, they decided to create new headquarters and a centre for innovative bicycle technology there. We have finished our coffee in the meantime and I follow Mr. Johanni into the development centre.

"Even though we are a multinational company with more than 400 engineers in five different time zones, the heart of SRAM developments beats here in Schweinfurt, which hardly anyone knows. Here, we focus on the further and new development of drivetrain technology. This includes cassettes, front derailleurs, rear mechs, shifters, chainrings and completely new parts."

However, SRAM wanted more than just further developing drivetrains under its roof. They wanted to play an important part in the bicycle market, which is why they again brought in lots of development power and bicycle innovations at the beginning of the 2000s. For this purpose, they took over the experts for mountain bike suspension fork and rear shock technology RockShox in 2002, and two years later Avid, the specialists in the field

of rim and disc brake systems, as well as Truvativ, the experts for bike hardware, bottom brackets and cranksets. With that, SRAM unites an impressive product portfolio of high-quality bike parts under its roof. "In an era of global change like this, we are of course all connected and maintain permanent contact with our colleagues.

This means that every department can adapt and benefit from the knowledge and art of engineering of the other. This proves extremely advantageous for our products," Mr. Johanni explains and leads me through a glass door out of the huge development area and into the Chamber of Secrets: the test lab.

"We have very high quality standards for our products," Mr. Johanni says and shows me a machine called DeMONSTRator.

This machine is currently letting a front derailleur shift through all gears under peak loads again and again. "Here, we torture our products and prototypes with loads that far exceed the loads they are subject to in real life. Everything is tested to the limit and beyond and evaluated with the help of computer-assisted data analyses. Based on these data, we cannot only achieve maximum robustness and durability for our products, but we also see where we can eventually save a few more grams. Of course, each product is not only tested in the laboratory, but also on extensive and demanding field test rides.

We want to deliver our customers a product that offers perfect support. We are all united by a huge passion for cycling and that is why we know first-hand what bikers need." "Do you do anything else here but developing and researching?" I want to know. "Of course we do. We are also home to a skill centre in which we train traders and experts from all over the world in SRAM products. Besides, there is the SRAM Technical University, our service centre, the dealer service direct, in short DSD, and of course the sales department, administration and logistics centre.

Here, we torture our products and prototypes with loads that far exceed the loads they are subject to in real life."

Yet our focus here in Schweinfurt is on the look into the future and the associated product development. I'm sure you know this from Bocholt. The guys from ROSE Bikes also develop in-house at a very high level. That is probably why we have been working together successfully for so many years now," Mr. Johanni says and smiles at me. In the meantime, our walk has led us to the fresh air again. "I hope I could answer all your questions. Did you enjoy it?" the person opposite asks. "It was quite impressive," I answer honestly. "Yet I have one more question. You talked about the look into the future. What do you see? What can the friends

of SRAM look forward to?" Mr. Johanni laughs. "Don't be so curious! You will find out early enough!" Okay, okay, I guess I was too brisk. So, I say thank you for the exciting morning and leave Schweinfurt in the direction of ROSE with lots of impressions from a remarkable and pioneering company!
